Greenough, railway official c.1900. Mandurah. C/E.

EACOTT, Thomas, b. 1803, d. 16.6.1887, arr. 14.5.1830 per Rockingham with wife & dtr., m. 1st Elizabeth b. 1803 d. 13.6.1830 (in childbirth), m. 2nd 2.7.1839 (Perth) Charlotte TUCKEY b. 1818 d. 15.7.1872, dtr. of John. Chd. 1st wife, Ann b. 1824, 2nd wife, Eleanor b. 1839, Thomas, Virtue b. 1842, Joseph John b. 1845, Elizabeth b. 1848, James b. 1850, Matilda b. 1852 d. 1932. Farmer. Mandurah (1842) & Dandalup 1848. C/E. Both illit.

EACOTT, Thomas, son of ?Thomas, m. Emily Maria b. 1857 d. 17.8.1948. Chd. Maude Elaine Eveline bp. 1885, Ida Hilda Lisette bp. 1885, Daisy Charlotte Gertrude bp. 1891. Farmer, Mandurah (1885-1886 Alm).

EACOTT, Virtue, b. 1842, dtr. of Thomas & Charlotte, m. William Frederick DAYE.

EACOTT, William, m. 12.1864 (Frem) Caroline Julia VICKERS b. 1846 (?Scotland) d. 1884, she arr. 8.4.1863 per Burlington as a servant. Chd. William Albert bp. 1865, Joseph John b. 1868, James bp. 1869, Israel bp. 1871, Robert Thomas bp. 1874. Pinjarra. C/E.

EACOTT, William Albert, bp. 4.6.1865 d. 18.6.1917, son of William & Caroline, m. Amy. Jarrahdale Timber Co. hauler (1884 Alm). Perth. Wife was at "Port Hotel", Derby at the time of his death.

E(A)DES, Charles, b. ?1831, (expiree). Arr. possibly 18.10.1851 per Minden or 1863 per Merchantman, m? Aboriginal Lucy COYNE (COYLE), 'a fine respectable woman'. Chd. Lucy, Albert, boy d. 10 mths, Mary b. 1891 (Perth RC). Kojonup, sandalwooder 1870, farmer & sheep owner (1884-1885 Alm). Owned 80 acres east of Albany. Employed 4 or 5 T/L men 1886-1877, first from York then from Albany (1877). In 1884 was in debt \$500, insolvent. 2 chd. sent to native home at Vasse. Wife went to work & kept her baby at Vasse. She was appointed as servant at Perth Poorhouse in 1887.

EADES, Charles?, b. 1840 d. 3.1867, (expiree). Arr. possibly 15.2.1863 per Merchantman or? 1851 per Minden. Carpenter, Frem. Assisted in building of Lass of Geraldton & was drowned when it was lost off Mandurah. Lit. Prot.

- EADES, George, b. 1824, d. 20.11.1902 (Mt Eliza Depot), (expirée). Arr. 18.10.1851 per Minden.
- EAGAN, Shepherd, employed by Hassell in Kojonup district. In 1848 he was sentenced to 3 yrs imprisonment for beating an Aborigine. He escaped by the end of the year.
- EAGLE, Alfred, from England, arr. 26.7.1869 per Hastings.
- EAGLE, Henry, b. 1838, (expirée). Arr. 29.5.1863 per Clyde. Employed a T/L man at Perth. Dep. 30.5.1877 per Pet from Bunbury.
- EAKINS, Elizabeth = (?B.), b. 1862, dtr. of John & Hannah (nee Crane), m. 19.10.1881 Charles Crowther COPE. School teacher at Greenough 1881.
- EAKINS, James William, b. 26.7.1858 (Perth), son of John & Hannah (nee Crane), m. 5.8.1884 (Perth RC) Catherine GAILLEY (wid. of John), dtr. of James & Catherine Fallon. Greenough, wheelwright (1879-1889 Alm).
- EAKINS, John, b. c.1813 (England), d. 12.12.1898 (Greenough), arr. 29.10.1830 per Cleopatra, m. c.1842 (Perth) Hannah CRANE b. 1824 d. 15.8.1903 (Greenough), dtr. of John (B) & Elizabeth, who arr. 15.12.1829 per Gilmore. Chd. Mary b. 1843, Samuel b. 1845 d. 1909, Sarah Matilda, James William b. 1858 (Perth), John b. 1860 d. 1898, Elizabeth b. 1862. He was a servant to G.F. Moore, Upper Swan (where Hannah was working) & was later at Canning as an agric. labourer. In partnership with J. Minchin as a sawyer, dissolved in 1841. Was in business as a blacksmith & wheelwright before moving to Greenough to become a farmer in 1860s owning 72 acres of freehold. Employed 20 T/L men on occasions 1864-1881.
- EAKIN(S), John, b. 21.11.1860 d. 12.12.1898, son of John Eakins & Hannah (nee Crane), m. Catherine SILCOCK b. 24.7.1864, dtr. of Joseph & Ann (nee Hunt). Chd. Lavinia bp. 1885 (Greenough C/E), Clarence, Maud, April, John, Joseph, William, Norah, Samuel, Elizabeth, Ruth, Joseph, Harold. Greenough, farmer. Stationhand at Wittenoom's Murchison lease. To "Wooligan" Tardun 1905-1945.
- EAKINS, Mary, b. 1843, dtr. of John & Hannah, m. 1860 Henry EVES.
- EAKINS, S. His wife Catherine Christina d. 17.3.1887 at her home in Roe Street, Perth.
- EAKINS, Samuel John, b. 14.5.1845, d. 10.8.1909, son of John & Hannah (nee Crane), m. 1st 5.11.1870 Mary Ann MORRISSEY b. 1846 d. 26.4.1874 (Mt. Hill), widow of Patrick & dtr. of Thomas Walsh, m. 2nd 12.9.1892 Elizabeth TICHBON b. 2.6.1852, dtr. of Henry & Sarah Ann (nee Crane). Employed at "Mt. Hill Station" Greenough sheep farmer (1886-9 Alm). Employed 2 T/L men 1873 & 1874.
- EAKINS, Sarah Matilda, dtr. of John & Hannah, m. 1881 James BELL.
- EAM, Geenda, b. 1817, d. 20.7.1844. Coolie employed by Little at Belvedere.

EAMER, James, b. 1820 (expiree), arr. 25.10.1850 per Hashemy. Dep. 22.6.1857 per Lochinvar for S.A.

EAMES, F. (?T.) R. Arr. 27.7.1887 per Triumph from New Zealand via Sydney & Darwin to Derby en route to Kimberley goldfields. Signed a bond to pay customs duties within 3 months.

EAMES, W.(?). Dep. 30.3.1887 per Chollerton for Eastern colonies.

EARL, G.W. Dep. 6.2.1863 per Alexandra for S.A. with wife & dtr.

EARL, George Swinson Windsor, b. 1805, arr. 14.2.1830 per Egyptian with several servants. To Augusta where he was assigned 2 Town Lots 1831. Apptd. clerk to Molloy. Dep. 23.7.1832 per Monkey for Pt. Essington & returned to England 1835.

EARL, Henry, b. 1811, d. 21.9.1889, arr. possibly 4.1854 per Sea Park as an Enrolled Pensioner Guard. Formerly Pte. 64th Regt. Frem. Town Lot 1863. Warder at Convict Establishment. He was admitted to Invalid Depot 1884 giving his pension as 1/- per day as support.

EARL, Hugh, b. 1833, (expiree). Arr. 29.5.1863 per Clyde. Dep. 22.1.1877 per Zephyr.

EARL, Mary Ann Selina, m. 1858 Robert Daniel WILLCOX.

EARL, Richard, b. 1800, arr. 5.8.1829 per Calista with wife Mary b. 1795 & nephew George b. 1817. Carpenter in Latour's party of settlers & was granted 100 acres. He received Govt. rations at Albany 4.1831 & 1834.

EARL, William Percy, arr. 26.2.1830 per Protector bringing 4 indentured servants & livestock. His partnership with Wallace Bickley was soon dissolved & he dep. 18.1.1831 per Eagle.

EARLANDON, Peter, b. 1834, arr. 12.1864 en route to Camden Harbour from Melbourne with wife b. 1836 & chd. Christina 3 yrs & Lottie 2 yrs. Member of abortive Camden Harbour Pastoral Assoc.

EARLE, Emily Agnes, b. 1866 d. 1951, dtr. of William & Sarah Ann, m. 1887 John KELLY.

EARLE, Harriet, m. Henry SCOTT.

EARLE, Henrietta, m. Andrew SCOTT.

EARLE, J., d. 29.4.1878 (Frem. Asylum).

EARLE, R. Geraldton, grocer's assistant (1885-1889 Alm).

EARLE, Stephen, b. 26.9.1863 (at sea), son of William & Sarah Ann (nee Slater). Arr. Tartar 12.12.1863 with parents, m. 1st 14.1.1885 (Geraldton RC) Elizabeth Margaret ROBSON b. 22.7.1863 (Toodyay), d. 9.3.1890 (Geraldton), ?dtr. of Thomas & Mary (nee Connor), m. 2nd Helen HARDWICK b. 1864 d. 1953. Chd. John, Fred, Grace (Sister Philomena), Amy, Lily. Geraldton, accountant (1888-1889 Alm).

EARLE, William (Stephen), b. 1834, arr. 12.12.1863 per Tartar with wife & 2 chd. m. Sarah Ann SLATER b. 1836. Chd. Sarah Ann b. 1857 (bp. 1863 Perth), Stephen b. 1863 (at sea), Emily Agnes b. 1866 (Frem RC) d. 1951, Robert b. 1869, Mary Ellen b. 1892, Joseph b. 1875 (Perth RC), William Francis b. 1877. Special Police Constable Fremantle in 1866 & Busselton by 1877. Applied for position of Bailiff at Geraldton in 1880, having been in Govt. service for 11 years. Geraldton labourer (1884-9 Alm).

EARLE, William, m. Mary. Chd. Harriet b. 1854. Bunbury, settler & owner of land in the district when he applied for a Bunbury Town Lot c.30.11.1852.

EARLS, (Pte) Joseph, of 21st Regt. stationed in WA 1833-1840. At Murray River 1833.

EARLY, Charlotte. Arr. Helena Mena 24.9.1886 from London.

EARLY, Frederick C. Arr. Helena Mena 24.9.1886 from London. Wife: Lucy. Chd. Susan, Charles, Caroline, George, Mary Ann, Elizabeth, Frederick.

EARLY, Harriet, m. John LEARY.

EARLY, Kathleen. Arr. Helena Mena 24.9.1886 from London.

EARLY, Susan. Arr. Helena Mena 24.9.1886 from London, dtr. of Frederick, m. 1887 George Thomas NICHOLS.

EARLY, William, m. Mary McDONNELL. Chd. Catherine Alice b. 1896 (Frem RC).

EARNshaw, Augusta Maud, b. 1853, dtr. of David, m. 1871 Francis BIRD.

EARNshaw, Clara, b. 1856, dtr. of David Fothergill, m. 1st F.H. JAUNCEY, m. 2nd 1888 Edwin Stammers MANSFIELD.

EARNSHAW, David Fothergill, b. 1812, d. 25.5.1871 (Vasse), according to family tradition he jumped ship but is said to have arr. 9.9.1833 per Jane from Hobart with 21st Regt. m. 24.7.1842 (Pictou) Mary POMEROY b. 1822 (England), d. 22.8.1905, dtr. of James & Susan (nee Cooper). Chd. Selina Emma b. 1843 d. 1929, Susan Mary b. 1845 d. 1926, Marion Ellen b. 1846 d. 1926, Ann b. 1848 d. 1848, Alfred b. 1850 d. 1850, Augusta Maud b. 1853 d. 1946, Clara b. 1856 d. 1889, Mary b. 1859 d. infant, Blanche Edna b. 1860 d. 1942. Was a Pte. in 21st Regt. stationed at Augusta 1833 & discharged in W.A. 1840. Apptd. gaoler & Police Constable at Vasse 1849-. Owned Town Lots at Busselton & held pastoral leases in districts of Wellington, Nelson & Sussex. Was a sawyer, farmer & publican employing 18 T/L men on occasions 1865-1871. His widow carried on the hotel licence & employed 3 T/L men 1871-1878.

EARNSHAW, Marion Ellen, b. 1846 d. 1926, dtr. of David Fothergill & Mary, m. George UGLOW.

EARNSHAW, Miss Selina Emma, b. 1843, dtr. of David, m. 1871 Donald MacPHERSON. Miss E. Govt. school teacher 1863-8 Vasse: Fremantle Infants School 1869.

EARNSHAW, Susan Mary, b. 1845, dtr. of David Fothergill, m. 1st 1863 Thomas TREEN.

EARP, Thomas, b. 1839, (expiree). Arr. 15.2.1863 per Merchantman. Greenough. Employed a T/L labourer 1866-1867.

EARP, William/or Michael, d. c.2.1.1888. Lived at Lucky Bay on Swan River, found drowned at Frem.

EASON, John, b. 1825 (expiree), arr. 29.3.1856 per William Hammond, m. W.A. 2 chd. Bricklayer & woodcutter at Frem. & Perth. ?Visited Eastern colonies & returned 7.12.1883 per Clyde.

EAST, Charles, b. 1858. Arr. Charlotte Padbury 29.9.1875 from London.

EAST, Edward Worth, b. 1854. Arr. Fitzroy 6.12.1876 from London. To Geraldton in employ of public entertainers. Carter. He had passed Civil Service exams in London & applied for a position in WA. Had served in India & China.

EAST, Elizabeth, b. 1840, m. 1867 John LOANE. Domestic servant.

EAST, George, b. 1857, d. 10.5.1894. Arr. Lady Elizabeth 27.5.1875 from London. Applied for 50 acres Avon district 1880 as an immigrant grant.

EAST, Joseph G., b. 1853. Arr. Oriana 16.7.1886 from London. Farm labourer.

EAST, William, arr. 25.6.1840 per Runnymede with Regt. m. Mary CLARKE. Chd. Rebecca, John b. 1841. Pte. 51st Regt. Stationed at Headquarters, Perth.

EAST, William, arr. 27.7.1850 per Sophie. Employed a T/L man 1866 Fremantle.

EASTB(O)URN, James, b. 1824 (expiree), arr. 10.7.1855 per Adelaide, wife Ann b. 1834 & 1 child followed 6.4.1859 per Hamilla Mitchell. Chd. ?June b. 1854, Walter b. 1860 d. 1860. Was a wool sorter in England. Albany. ?Employed a T/L man 1871 at York.

EASTCOTT, J. (?see ESCOTT). Dep. 11.9.1888 per Victorian for Melbourne.

EASTHAM, George, b. 1858. Arr. 8.10.1886 per Gulf of St. Vincent from London. Dep. 24.12.1886 per Albany for Adelaide. Miner.

EASTICK, Charles, b. 1840, arr. 24.6.1862 per Mary Harrison with wife Sarah b. 1839. Gardener.

EASTLAND, Fanny, b. 1871 d. 1935, m. 1896 William NICHOLLS.

EASTMAN, Henry Lyle, m. Mary Alice TIMPERLEY bp. 30.8.1868, dtr. of William Henry & Rebecca (nee Properjohn).

 Dep. 17.4.1886 per Franklin for Melbourne.

EASTON, Frank Gill, b. 1.11.1866/8 (Frem.) d. 2.2.1917, son of Walter James & Susan Gwythyr (nee Stratford), m. 12.4.1900 (Mandurah) Minnie May COOPER b. 15.6.1879 (Mandurah), dtr. of James & Ellen (nee Tuckey). 6 chd: Walter James bp. 1901, May Gwythyr Frank bp. 1902, Winifred Gill b. 1904. Farmer, Wickepin. His wid. carried on with 2 sons' help.

EASTON, Guy Norman, b. 19.4.1874 d. 1954, son of Walter James & Susan Gwythyr (nee Stratford), m. 1898 Jessie COOPER bp. 4.8.1872 d. 1948, dtr. of James & Ellen (nee Tuckey). Chd. Ethel Cooper bp. 1899, Kate Laura bp. 1904, Marjorie, Betty, Guy Norman, Maxwell Cranworth & 2 d. infancy. Frem., farmer & vineyard proprietor (1884-1885 Alm), carrying on his father's property "Windsor" until it was subdivided. Worked for W.D. Moore, erecting windmills in North West. Managed a farm at Pinjarra for Charles Wearne (brother-in-law) & went farming at Newdegate with son Guy.

EASTON, Mary Agnes Dora, b. 1870 d. 1939, dtr. of Walter, m. 1894 Albert BULGIN b. 1870.

EASTON, Maude Evangeline, b. 1867 d. 1955, dtr. of Walter, m. 1890 George Frederick PAYNE.

EASTON, Walter James, b. 1825 (England), d. 31.7.1893, son of Daniel & Selina (nee Gill), arr. 12.2.1858 per Lochnagar with wife, m. 1.9.1857 (England) Susan Gwythyr STRATFORD b. 1832 d. 19.8.1909 (E.Frem), dtr. of Edward G. & Selina. Chd. 2 d. infancy, George Gwythr Faithful b. 1863 d. 1866, Ethel Selena Llanworne b. 1863 d. 1865, Walter Daniel St. John b. 1865 d. 1866, Maud Evangeline Morgan b. 1867 d. 1955, Frank Gill b. 1868 d. 1917, Mary Agnes Dora b. 1870 d. 1939, Susannah Selina b. 1872 d. 1954, Guy Norman b. 1874 d. 1954. Chemist & school master in England. Apptd. as Schoolmaster at Fremantle Convict Establ. @ £128 per annum. In 1861 was a committee member of Fremantle Mechanics' Institute. He owned land at E.Frem. & established "Windsor" Vineyard & Orchard in 1865. Employed 4 T/L men 1865-1868. He made wine & held a Colonial Licence 1872. In 1885 applied for licence for premises in High St. C/E.

EASTON, William James, m. Chd. Frederick William b. 1896 (bp. Frem. RC). RC. Wife Presbyt.

EASTOUGH, Catherine Mary, dtr. of Charles, m. Michael FARRELL.

EASTOUGH, Charles, b. 1820 (England), d. 15.12.1885 (Geraldton) (expiree), arr. 7.8.1854 per Ramillies, m. 14.11.1857 Bridget CORNELLY widow of Farrel Cornelly, dtr. of Terence O'Loughlin, d. 23.10.1892. Chd. Charles (Tommy) b. 1859 d. 1943, Emma b. 1860 d. 1942, James b. 1863 d. 1945, ?Emilia b. 1864, Kate b. 1865, William b. 1867 (Perth), Catherine Mary. Carpenter, blacksmith, wheelwright & farmer at Chapman Valley. Employed 7 T/L men 1863-1874. Lit. Wife illit. RC.

EASTOUGH, Charles (Tommy), b. 2.12.1859 d. 1943, son of Charles & Bridget, m. 1881 Mary JOHNSON b. 15.4.1865 d. 1932, dtr. of Herbert & Mary (nee Llewelyn). Chd. Tom, Charles, Elizabeth, Bridget, Kathleen, Lelia, James, Jack, Joseph, Lawrence. Northampton, farmer, miner (1875-1889 Alm).

EASTOUGH, Emma, b. 1860, dtr. of Charles & Bridget, m. James LAUDER.

EASTOUGH, James, b. 30.11.1863 d. 21.6.1945, son of Charles & Bridget, m. 1889 (Geraldton) Mary Ann MURPHY b. 1873 d. 17.1.1938 (Nabawa), dtr. of Michael & Sarah Ann (nee Bunter). Chd. James Charles b. 1889 d. 1965, Mary, Margaret (Daisy), John, Rose, Norah, Kate, Susan, Bertha, Cecil, Arthur. Worked on the lead mines, "Narra Tarra". Geraldton Chapman. Blacksmith (1885- Alm) & builder & carpenter. Settled on small block nr. the mine & called their home "Hickety". Was drowned at Cooper's Crossing on Chapman River.

EASTOUGH, Kate, dtr. of Charles & Bridget, m. Robert KEMPTON.

EASTOUGH, Mary, m. John O'DONNELL.

EASTOUGH, William Henry, b. 10.1.1867 d. 11.10.1942 (Leederville), son of Charles & Bridget, m. Mary LAUDER b. c.1876 d. 13.8.1920 (Geraldton), niece of James Park Lauder. Chd. Norman, (Bessie) Elizabeth. He & his wife visited United Kingdom. Chapman Valley farmer, carpenter, blacksmith, builder & horse breeder. His home at Yetna was called "The Orangery". His wife conducted the Yetna Post Office & telephone exchange. Retired to Leederville c.1920. RC.

EASTWOOD, Charles, b. 1835, (expiree). Arr. 22.11.1865 per Vimeira (wife & 2 chd., U.K.). Employed 5 T/L men at Greenough 1871-1881.

EASTWOOD, Daniel. (see CAHILL)

EASTWOOD, Eliza, dtr. of William, m. 1867 Abel Israel JONES.

EASTWOOD, Joseph, b. 30.1.1873 (S.A.) d. 29.11.1950 (buried Gnowangerup), son of Sampson & Ann (nee Marsh). Arr. 1888 & again during gold rush, m. 15.5.1906 (Broomehill, "Beegenup") Mary Elizabeth BURRIDGE b. 1.5.1888 living 1979, dtr. of Richard Robert & Mary (nee Searle). Chd. Emily b. 1907, Leonard b. 1908, Fred b. 1910, Hilda, Edgar, Albert, Norman, Charlie. Came 1st with father & brother. Miner on White Feather (above ground) - carted stores. Worked a condenser & sold water. To Broomehill as a boundary rider on Brassey's Pallinup Est. Selected land at Gnowangerup "Oakbank", Ongerup. C/E.

EASTWOOD, Joshua. Geraldton, warehouseman. Boardinghouse keeper (1879-1889 Alm).

EASTWOOD, Mark, b. 1856. Arr. Lady Louisa 19.12.1875 from London.

EASTWOOD, William, b. 1813 (expiree), arr. 10.8.1854 per Ramillies, wife & chd. followed 22.11.1858 per Dolphin, m. (U.K.) Emily, she m. 2nd 19.4.1863 (Frem) James COBB. Chd. Eliza. Mason. Semi lit. Prot.

EATCH, John, b. 1852. Arr. Daylight 16.8.1876 to Pt. Walcot in North West 2.12.1876 per Azalea. Formerly a farmer in U.K. Roebourne teamster. Maitland River 1880-1885 & overseer 1884. Police constable 1882. Resigned, charged at Derby 1887 with murder of Aborigine 'Charcoal'. Sentenced to 1 year's hard labour.
