Chd. Robert Edward b. 1873 d. 1947, Clara Sophia b. 1875 d. 1967, Charles James b. 1877 d. 1926, William Sydney b. 1878 d. 1964. Frem. Master mariner. Captain of Dawn owned by McRae & Pearse. He was lost at sea while in command of Waratah bound for Cossack (owner James Clarke). Mrs Owen lived at Norfolk St. Frem.
