

PACE, E. b. 1826, son of Walter. Butcher, employing a Parkhurst lad 1843. Attended a meeting of shareholders of WA Mining Co. in 1.1847.

PACE, Jane, b. 1818, dtr. of Walter, m. 1836 Stephen George HENTY.

PACE, Mary Ann, b. 1824/5, dtr. of Walter, m. 1842 Benjamin Franklin HELPMAN.

PACE, Mary Elizabeth, arr. 2.11.1836 per Joshua Carroll from London. Visited her sister Mrs Jane Henty in Victoria 25.9.1839, m. William SAMSON.

PACE, (Capt) Walter M, Captain of Medina, arr. 6.7.1830 & returned per Ann 1832 followed by his wife & 3 chd 19.4.1834 per Quebec Trader. m. Elizabeth b. 1792 d. 5.1874 (Vic). Chd. Jane b. 1818, Mary Ann b. 1824/5, son E. b. 1826, ?son, Mary Elizabeth d. 1860 (SA). Formerly in service of East India Co. Trader at Frem. Selected 5,000 acres in Avon district & 12 acres in Swan district in 22.2.1831. Master of Monkey trading with Mauritius & East Indies. His wife was licensee of "Crown & Thistle Hotel", leased to P.Marmion 1837. She conducted a store at Frem. with assistance of her dtrs. Shareholders in Frem. Whaling Co. Mrs Pace visited her dtrs in Eastern Australia in 1845.

PACEY, Thomas, b. 1827, (expiree), son of Robert, arr. 9.1.1855 per Guide, m. 4.8.1860 (Perth RC) Margaret BURGESS, she arr. possibly 20.10.1859 per West Australian, dtr. of John. Chd. Mary Jane b. 1860 (Perth). To Mauritius with family 19.12.1860 per New Perseverance. An ex soldier. C/E.

PACHE, Frau Lione. Arr. 24.9.1886 per Helena Mena from London.

PACK, Josiah, b. 1813, d. 10.1850. Wheelwright, living on Alfred Carson's farm, Upper Swan.

PACKENHAM. H. Lt. RN, of HMS Challenger arr. 4.12.1829. Applied for grant of land.

PACKHAM (PECKHAM), Henry, b. 1813, d. 5.12.1868 (Perth) (expiree), arr. 18.10.1851 per Minden.

PACKMAN, John, b. 1856 (England), d. 2.6.1935 (Northam), son of John & Sarah Ann (nee Broad of England), sister of John in W.A. Arr. 24.1.1877 per Clifton on a visit, came to settle 1891 per Ballarat from Victoria with cousins Broad, m. 10.12.1880 (England) Emma COFFYN b. 1855 (England) d. 27.6.1948 (Tammin). Chd. John b. 1882 d. 1958, Winifred b. 1884 d. 1955, Millicent b. 1886 d. 1959, Frank b. 1889 d. 1975, Thomas b. 1892 (Frem). Butchering business Frem. 1891-2. Farmer "Doongin Peak" Avon Loc 457 Tammin. C/E.

PACKWOOD, Luke, b. 1831 (expiree). Arr. 29.3.1856 per William Hammond. Employed a T/L servant at Champion Bay 1869.

PACKWOOD, W.A. Arr. 21.1.1887 per Hampshire with wife & 3 chd.

PADBURY, Annie, bp. 30.11.1874 (Perth C/E), Aboriginal, lived at the Native Institution.

PADBURY, Edwin, b. 1811, d. 2.1.1876 (Bunbury). Blackwood district farmer & grazier. Employed 23 T/L men on occasions 1864-1875. His widow was listed as a boardinghouse keeper (1882-4 Alm).

PADBURY, Mark, b. 1822, d. 5.9.1886 (Bridgetown), brought to WA by Walter Padbury, m. 1st 14.10.1851 (Perth C/E) Louisa WALKER b. 1834, she arr. 10.4.1842 per Diadam with father Thomas, m. 2nd 14.11.1860 (Bunbury C/E) Charlotte Matilda BLYTHE b. 6.5.1846 d. 20.5.1926, dtr. of James & Comfort, she m. 2nd 1889 George Chandler DOWDEN. Chd. Louisa Elizabeth b. 1853 d. 1854. Employed by Walter Padbury. Convicted of cattle duffing 1854. Gained T/L 1856 & became a well respected farmer & grazier. Employed T/L men at Perth 1853 & 1857, at "Yathroo" 1858, 1865 & 1875, & 17 T/L men at Blackwood (where he established his own farm) on occasions 1868-1880. Held extensive leasehold on the coast near Donnelly River 1862.

PADBURY, Matthew, b. 19.2.1870, d. 3.11.1956, nephew of Walter, m. 22.9.1896 Esther NAIRN b. 30.9.1863 d. 11.7.1934, dtr. of William & Jane (nee Graves). Koojan 1892, farmer & pastoralist. Chairman of Moora Rd. Bd. & of Moora Co-op Soc., also of West Australian Farmers, & of Farmers' & Settlers' Assoc. Member of Repatriation Committee, Vice Chairman of Moora Hospital Bd, Member of Moora Club. Churchwarden of Padbury Memorial Church. His wife represented the parish on Synod & was active in the management of Anglican orphanages. Retired to "Rose Hill", Guildford.

PADBURY, (Mrs) Ruth, b. c.1789 (England), d. 22.12.1872 (Guildford). Brought to Australia by son Walter.

PADBURY, Ruth, b. 1829, m. 1851 William COUSINS.

PADBURY, Samuel, m. Helen Susan. Chd. Ada Harriet b. 1859, Percy George b. 1861, Catherine Mary b. 1864. Fremantle, storekeeper 1858. Steward Convict Establishment 1861. Transferred to Eng. on promotion 1866.

PADBURY, Thomas, b. 1791, d. 7.1830. Arr. 26.2.1830 per Protector with his son Walter intending to bring the rest of his family to WA. He was granted 1050 acres, which was returned to the Crown after his death.

PADBURY, Thomas. Arr. 2.10.1888 per Charlotte Padbury from London.

PADBURY, Walter, b. 22.12.1820 (Eng), d. 18.4.1907, son of Thomas, arr. 26.2.1830 per Protector with his father, m. 23.4.1844 Charlotte NAIRN b. 14.2.1826 d. 1.2.1895, dtr. of William & Mary who arr. 1829 per Marquis of Anglesea. Chd. Dtr. b. 1859 (Frem) d. young. He was unsuccessful in appeal to receive his father's grant. Employed by Burges brothers as a shepherd at York. By 1844 was beginning his career as a storekeeper, butcher & merchant at Perth. Acquired several pastoral stations 1847- including "Yathroo" in Victoria Plains & others in Blackwood district. Sent the first stock to the Northwest 1863. Owned vessels Emma (lost at sea 1867), Bridgetown 1865 & Charlotte Padbury. In partnership with W.T. Loton 1867 & bt. J. Farmaner's business. Qualified as a juror 1860 with £1500 personal estate. Brought relatives from Eng. to assist in managing his properties. Employed 60 T/L men on occasions 1851-1887 mostly at "Yathroo". Perth City Councillor 1862. Member of Agric. Soc. & President 1875-6, Vice President at time of death. MLC for Swan 12.1872-1.1878. JP 1883. Chairman of Guildford Munic. Council & 1st Mayor 1885. Established Peerless Flour Mill at Guildford 1898. Planned to retire to Eng. 1878 but returned to WA 1880. Left many bequests to church & charity. Commemorated in 1979 in a brass plaque in Perth pavement for year 1863.

PADBURY, William, b. 31.8.1867, m. 13.1.1897 Evelyn Mary WELLMAN b. 16.6.1873 (Guildford), dtr. of William & Eliza (nee Church). Chd. Doris Ruth b. 1898, Albany William b. 1900, Evelyn May, Marion Haynes, Mary Madeline b. 1908 d. 1937, Margaret Esther d. 1948. Manager of Guildford Store, bought "Millendon", unsuccessful in business.

PADDIN, William H., b. 1857. Arr. 16.7.1886 per Oriana from London. Carpenter.

PADDINGTON, John (James). Arr. 1.1.1886 per Mennock (steerage) with M.A. James petitioned for the post office at Gordon River, he moved to Tunney 1887,

PADDISON, Arthur Everard, m. 7.11.1894 Ann Margaret CONGDON b. 14.2.1874, dtr. of Daniel Keen & Jane Ainslie (nee Fairbairn).

PADDOCK, J. Arr. 3.4.1882 per Macedon from Eastern colonies.

PADDON, Charles, m. Mary FAHEY b. 1870, dtr. of Michael & Cecilia (nee Murphy).

PADMAN, Thomas. Arr. 4.1878 per Assam, dep. 3.8.1878 per Rob Roy. Representative for AMP, made a lecture tour of W.A. 1878 to sponsor business.

PADOLA, Michael. Arr. 11.1871 per Emily Smith from S.A.

PADDY, John, arr. from SA 12.1.1856 per Swan.

PAEPPEL(?), A. Arr. 17.8.1876 per Georgette from Albany.

PAGE, Charles. Arr. 25.7.1885 per Franklin from S.A. Joined Police Force 1.8.1885 at Frem. Posted to Roebourne 10.3.1886. Resigned 14.3.1888 & dep. 2.12.1888 per Albany for S.A.

PAGE, Edward, son of Edward (tradesman), m. 27.11.1887 (Albany C/E) Florence COOKE, dtr. of John (labourer). Labourer. Albany.

PAGE, Emily Louise. Arr. 4.6.1886 per Otago from England, m. 1886 Samuel PETERS.

PAGE, F. Arr. 20.5.1861 per Gleam, arr. 1.2.1862 per Robert Morrison, dep. for London 18.1.1866 per Fitzroy, m. Margaret. Perth. Asst. at Colonial Hospital. To Newcastle, England. Son born there 21.1.1880.

PAGE, James. Arr. 24.9.1886 per Helena Mena from London.

PAGE, John, b. 1840 (England), d. 18.8.1898 (W. Perth). Arr. 16.7.1886 per Oriana from London, m. 1881 (England) Eliza FLETCHER b. 2.12.1859 d. 19.5.1922. Chd. John Henry b. 1882, Charles F. b. 1883, Albert b. 1885, Annie E. b. 1887, Ruby (?Ruth), George b. 1892, William E. b. 1898. ?This man Roebourne Police Constable (1887-8 Alm). ?To Victoria & returned to W.A. 1895 & worked in WAGR.

PAGE, John Henry Markham, son of Edmund (?James), m. 30.11.1867 (York) Sarah Harrison BLECHYNDEN b. 15.4.1841, dtr. of Harrison (farmer). Chd. Susannah Markham bp. 1873, James Henry bp. 1873. Was living in Blackwood district by 1867. Listed at Williams (1879-1899 Alm). Employed 3 T/L men on occasions 1863 & 1870-1875 including 2 sawyers. C/E.

PAGE, Joseph, b. 1818 (expiree). Arr. 3.7.1857 per Clara, widower, 2 chd. in U.K. Employed a T/L man at Northam 1860. Left for Adelaide 20.1.1879.

PAGE, Thomas. Arr. 29.12.1886 per Elderslie from London, wife Elizabeth. Chd. Henry, William, Alfred.

PAGE, W.C. Arr. per Triumph from New Zealand to Derby, via Sydney & Darwin, ?en route to Kimberley Goldfields 27.7.1886. Signed petition protesting against quarantine for a case of scarlatina.

PAGE, William J. Arr. 8.1839 per Fox from Tasmania. Servant to Charles Harper.

PAGELSON, m. Emma READ b. 13.1.1873, dtr. of William James & Jane (nee Broad).

PAGER, James, b. c.1826 (possibly Gibraltar), d. 12.4.1894 (Geraldton) (expiree), son of William (ex soldier) & Bridget (nee McGrane, arr. 3.7.1857 per Clara, m. 1st 5.11.1847 (Eng) Mary Jane JONES b. c.1824 d. 2.8.1889 (typhoid), she arr. 1880 per Lady Douglas with family, m. 2nd 21.8.1890 (Greenough West) Bessie TRURAN b. 1874, dtr. of Thomas & Ellen (arr. 1881). Chd. (1st) William John b. 1849, James Albert b. 1852 d. 1884 (Eng), (2nd) William Edward b. 1890, Bessie b. 1891, Mary Ellen b. 1891, Samuel James b. 1893 (Geraldton). Northampton, baker, confectioner (licensed 1870) & grocer (Advt. 1878). Employed 17 T/L men on occasions 1863-1880. In 1877 signed a petition regarding discrimination against expirees. To Geraldton & est. "Manchester Bakery" 1880. Made his will 11.4.1894, the executor to be Joseph Payne. All his worldly goods to his wife, his son having returned to England & died there.

PAGET, (Pte) John, of 21st Regt. stationed in WA 1833-1840. At Perth 1833.

PAGET, M.J. Arr. 12.4.1880 per Lady Douglas from London, wife J.A. Chd. Ellen, I.R., Annie, M. Elizabeth.

PAIN, John, b. 1828 (expiree). Arr. 13.4.1864 per Clara, wife & 2 chd. in U.K. Left for London 16.1.1876.

PAINE (Indistinguishable), (see PAYNE).

Mr & Miss, arr. 8.11.1854 per Pacifico from Melbourne.

W. arr. from Melbourne 12.1.1856 per Eblano

W. dep. for S.A. 2.2.1856.

PAINE, Henry Hammond, arr. possibly 19.6.1824 at Albany per James Pattison. By 30.10.1834 was in need of rations.

PAINE, John (James), b. 1818 (see PAYNE), arr. 19.6.1834 per James Pattison at Albany as an orphan sent out by Childrens' Friend Society.

PAINTER, James, b. 1816 (Eng). Servant (1832 Census).

PAINTER, Ursula May, m. William Edward STRICKLAND.

PAINTER, William, b. 1832 (expiree). Arr. 9.6.1862 per Norwood. Shepherd employed by Dempster at Esperance 1878. Dep. 3.1.1888 for London.

PAISLEY, John, b. 1869 or 5.1870 (Toodyay), d. 11.6.1938, son of Thomas & Margaret (nee Wilson), m. 10.1904 Dorothea Hilda WIEDIMANN. 2nd Schoolmaster Bunbury (1887-9 Alm). Bank Officer. Bairnsdale, Victoria.

PAISLEY, Minnie, b. 1864, d. 1928, dtr. of Thomas & Margaret, m. Thomas William LLOYD.

PAISLEY, Thomas W, b. 1829 (Ireland), d. 13.10.1882 (Frem), arr. 15.2.1863 per Merchantman with wife & 1 chd. m. (Bahamas) 1858 Margaret WILSON b. 1842 d. 18.9.1910. Chd. Thomas William b. 1861 (Bermuda) d. 1928, dtr. bp. 1863, Minnie b. 1864 (WA) d. 1928, Henry George b. 1866 d. 1866 (Toodyay), Joseph b. 1867 d. 1867, Emma Margaret b. 1868 d. 1869, John b. 1870 (or 1869) (Toodyay) d. 1938. Arr. as a warder & bt. Swan Town Lot 1863. Appointed as principal warder at Toodyay by 1869 & transferred to Guildford by 1872 & to Frem by 1874. He was principal warder at the Lunatic Asylum by 1876, having been in the Imperial Service for 22 years, salary £181.12.0. per annum. He employed 7 T/L men on occasions 1864-1878. His widow & dtr. visited Eastern Australia 1883 & 13.5.1888 per South Australian.

Arr. 15.2.1863 with parents per Merchantman, m. 6.1.1886 (Busselton) Martha Rabinay McGREGOR b. 4.4.1866 d. 25.10.1949, dtr. of Daniel & Agnes (nee Lockhart). Chd. Ivy Gladys b. 1886 (Bunbury) d. 1947, Leslie William b. 1888 d. 1974, Selwyn Addey b. 1890 d. 1958, Vera Agnes Margaret b. 1892 d. 1974, Cyril John b. 1894 d. 1951, Thomas McGregor b. 1904 d. 1930. Bunbury. School teacher 1881. Lay preacher in Anglican Church.

PALMATEER, George Henry, son of Francis (farmer), m. 28.4.1897 (Guildford C/E) Lucy Ann Jane WALLIS b. 13.4.1877 d. 1962, dtr. of John & Emma (nee Green). Orchardist "Heidelberg" Kalamunda.

PALMER, (Indistinguishable).

Mr arr. 27.2.1873 per Frederica from Eastern colonies.

PALMER, Charles. Employed 6 T/L labourers at Geraldton 1874-1875.

PALMER, Charles Henry, b. 1813, d. 17.7.1865 (Toodyay), arr. as an Enrolled Pensioner Guard with wife & chd., m. Anastasia BASSETT b. 1814 (Ireland) d. 27.6.1868 (Toodyay). Chd. Letitia b. c.1840 (bp. RC 1863), Mary Matilda b. 1855 (bp RC 1865). Formerly Pte 70th Regt. Promoted to Cpl 20.9.1844. Stationed at Toodyay Convict Depot. Bt. Newcastle Town Lot S15 of 6 acres in 1860 & was granted S13 of 4 acres 1866. His widow was assigned Pens. Lot 313 on 31.12.1866. He employed a T/L cowherder 1863. Lit. C/E.

PALMER, Edwin G., b. 1863, son of Thomas Matthew & Elizabeth (nee Thomas). Albany. Storeman (1885 Alm).

► PALMER, Eleanor, b. 1862. Listed among 10 single girls aged 17-35 years as sailing from London, arr. 22.1.1886 per Abington. Admitted to Womens' Home 25.2.1888 pregnant.

PALMER, Elizabeth Annie, m. 1885 (Victoria) Hubert Edward GULL.

PALMER, Emma, b. 1869, d. 1951, dtr. of Thomas Matthew & Elizabeth, m. 1888 Edwin Charles Doust KEYSER.

F. dep. 12.9.1877 per Daylight for London, arr. 23.7.1883 per Siam & proceeded to North West ports and ?London 6.8.1883 per Chiselhurst.

R.F. arr. 26.2.1885 per South Australian from Victoria.

PALMER, Fred. Arr. 4.8.1838 per Shepherd at Fremantle. A whaler, applied for a sawyer's licence 11.1842. At Bunbury 1844 & Toodyay 1849. ?This man arr. from Champion Bay 2.1850 per Champion, one of a party returning from the new settlement at Geraldton.

PALMER, (Rev.) George A. Arr. 21.11.1883 per Franklin from Eastern colonies with wife, dep. 3.8.1886 per Franklin for Eastern Colonies with family, m. 17.10.1883 (Adelaide) Martha JOHNSON, dtr. of Richard (of S.A). Chd. 1 dtr. b. 1884 (Frem). Congreg. minister Frem. (1886 Alm). Co-Pastor at Johnston Memorial Church.

PALMER, H. Lost at sea off North West coast 24.1.1879 when Rosette disappeared.

PALMER, Helena, b. 1867, dtr. of Thomas Matthew & Elizabeth (nee Thomas), m. 1898 Charles Alfred BOND.

PALMER, Henry, b. 1842 (expiree). Arr. 9.6.1862 per Norwood. Employed a T/L man at Bunbury 1870. Dep. for Shanghai 6.5.1871.

PALMER, J. Pearler. Cossack 1885 with Mallet? Trader Roebourne (1886-9 Alm). Station manager Gascoyne (1884-1889 Alm).

PALMER, J. M. Busselton (1876 Alm).

PALMER, James. Employed 3 T/L men 1873 & 1877 at Toodyay & York.

PALMER, James (John). Made several voyages between W.A. & Victoria. Dtr. Elizabeth m. 1886 (Victoria) Hubert GULL. Melbourne surveyor & civil engineer who contracted to mark out the route of the railway from Geraldton to Northampton, employing 62 T/L men 1874-1879.

PALMER, John Reynolds, b. 1821, d. 19.4.1861 (Albany), Capt. of 12th Foot 1st Battalion, arr. 7.2.1856 per Windsor from Tasmania with wife & 1 child, dep. 24.6.1859 & returned 24.1.1860.

PALMER, L. (See Eleanor Palmer). Arr. 13.4.1884 per Abington (steerage) from London.

PALMER, Letitia, b. 1840, dtr. of Charles Henry & Anastasia, m. 1859 John Robertson.

PALMER, Maria (widow of Robert), m. 28.7.1840 (Perth) John BUTTERWORTH.

PALMER, Mary Ann Caroline, b. 1833, dtr. of Robert, m. 1852 William OAK (or OAKS).

PALMER, Richard. Was imprisoned for larceny at Frem. 2.1830. He owed money to J.B. Cox who prevented his departure 28.9.1831 per Sulphur.

PALMER, Robert. Geraldton Mine Manager (1879-1881 Alm). Employed 32 T/L men at the mines 1865-1878. Cossack Contractor 1885. Petitioned for a JP at Cossack 1.4.1887.

PALMER, Robert Greenslade, b. 1792, d. 19.9.1838, arr. 14.5.1830 per Rockingham with wife Maria, who m. 2nd 28.7.1840 John BUTTERWORTH. Chd. William b. 1824, James b. 1828, Mary Anne Caroline b. 1833. Owned Guildford Lot 88 of 3.5 acres.

PALMER, Thomas, son of John & Catherine, m. 2.1.1872 (Perth RC) Catherine BROWN, dtr. of Thomas & Mary (nee Downey). Employed 2 T/L men 1870 & 1877 at Perth. Wife RC. Prot.

PALMER, Thomas G., b. 1865, son of Thomas Matthew & Elizabeth (nee Thomas), m. (Kojonup) 26.6.1888 Mary Ann CORNWALL b. 6.9.1864 d. 25.9.1935, dtr. of William Walter & Eliza (nee Malone).

PALMER, Thomas Matthew, b. 1824, d. 1893 (Albany) (expiree), son of John, arr. 28.3.1854 per Sea Park, m. 9.1.1858 (Albany) Elizabeth THOMAS b. 1837, dtr. of William Charles & Mary. Chd. PEEL, Luke. Employed a T/L man at "Peelhurst" in Murray district 1871.

PEEL, Robert, b. 1845, (expirée). Arr. 10.8.1865 per Racehorse. Northampton. In 1877 signed a petition regarding discrimination against expees. Dep. for S.A. 4.4.1879.

PEEL, Thomas, b. 1793, d. 21.12.1865 (Mandurah), son of Thomas & Dorothy, arr. 15.12.1829 per Gilmore with his illeg. son Fred, m. 1823 (Eng) Mary Charlotte Dorking AYRTON b. c.1800 d. 1857 (Eng), who followed to WA 18.4.1834 per Quebec Trader with their 3 chd. & her mother Mrs Ayrton. Chd. Fred b. 1819 d. 1872, Julia b. 1824 d. 1856 (Eng), Thomas b. 1826 d. 1892, Dorothy Ann (Dora) b. 1827 d. 1907. Peel & London financier Solomon Levey promoted an ambitious migration scheme, bringing settlers to the colony in the Gilmore, Houghly (arr. 13.2.1830), & Rockingham (arr. 14.5.1839). His tardy arrival deprived him of favoured land grants in Swan district. After a disastrous settlement at Clarence, he accepted land in Murray district. Most of his people settled in other parts of the colony or moved to Eastern Australia. Member of Roads Trust 1839 & MLC 1840-1.

PEEL, Thomas, b. 1826, d. 20.4.1892 (E.Perth), arr. 18.4.1834 per Quebec Trader to join his father, accompanied by his mother Mary & sisters. PEGLER, John (James), arr. 3.9.1853 per Clara with wife Elizabeth & 1 child. Chd. Francis b. 1842 bp. RC 1865, ?Joseph. Perth. Town Lots 1860 & 1866. Canning, saddler, harness maker & gardener. Employed 25 T/L men on occasions 1857-1873, some of them saddlers at Perth & some on timber works (at the Sound Road). Qualified as juror 1860 with £150 personal estate.

Granted 18,053 acres, he selected 4,000 in Canning district & 14,000 in Avon district. Lived at his farm "Coleraine", Canning, where he was JP 1830 & Supt. of Native Tribes 21.2.1834 (CSO 30/233). He dep. 3.1836 per Elizabeth for Tasmania. His wife & son followed 2.1838 per Gail Lardon.

PEICE, Edward, b. 1833, arr. 5.1851 per Mermaid. A Parkhurst boy. Listed in PRO records as having been sent to WA. Not in Vol. II Dictionary of WA. A gunsmith.
