Mary TURRELL

Arrived in Perth 13-2-1830 on the "Hooghly". Listed in 1832 Census #559, age 45 years also mentioned in the 1837 Census.

In November 1840 signed a petition for a Methodist minister's stipend(salary) at Perth.

William STRICKLAND

Arrived in Perth on 13-2-1830 on the "Hooghly" with parents and siblings.

Listed in the 1832 Census #555, aged 22 years. Advertised on the 3 November 1841 Land For Sale near Lake Thompson with House and Orchard.

Appointed Civil Administrator at Fremantle in 1843

In January 1849 left on the "Emma Sherratt" for South Australia with his wife and son.

David STRICKLAND

David was born about 1818 in London, Middlesex, England he arrived in the Swan River Colony on the 12 February 1830 on the 'Hooghly' with his parents and 5 siblings.

Worked on the schooner 'ELLEN' but quit in June 1834, on the 1 December 1834 he was listed as a seaman on the 'Fanny' sailing to Java, working for Curtis of Fremantle.

The time between his work for Curtis and his marriage to Harriet Baldick on 8 Feb 1848 in Port Underwood, Marlborough, New Zealand is unknown (still searching). Captain David Strickland is believed to have come to Cloudy Bay on a whaler owned by Captain Jack Guard, and to have met Harriet there.

He resided at 62 Oxford Street in 1852 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand. They had a beautiful view of the harbour, and safe mooring for the boat. There was basic schooling for the children, as well. He and Harriet baptised four of their children at Holy Trinity Church in Lyttleton. Sponsors included Mary Taylor, William Baldock, H Cameron, Mary Ann Baldock and George Baldock.

He was a Captain of the General Palmer, locally known as the "Jumping Jackass" in 1853 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand. David was listed on the Electoral Roll as Mariner, Freeholder and Householder on 9 Jul 1853 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand. He was a Waterman of Oxford Street in 1860 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand.

Watermen would meet the incoming ships, brought messages and parcel back. They were in demand by captains passing to and fro, who found it more convenient to employ them than to employ their own crews. Agents who had business to do with the ships found them to be an indispensable service. At the port, some days business would be brisk when several overseas vessels would arrive at once and there would be great competition with the watermen. The largest boat engaged in this trade was about the seven-ton mark. Even when the deep-water wharf was built, the watermen were still needed, to take people and provisions to and from ships waiting either to berth or for a favourable wind to leave the

harbour.

But by the 1880s the predominance of steam over sail was such that, in combination with the new wharfs adjacent to deep water, the need for the watermen had largely disappeared. He Entered on List of Persons 1860 Liable to Serve as Militiamen on 16 Jun 1860 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand.

David and Harriet were separated, Harriet and children returning to Blenheim about 1871. He was a Fishmonger between 1880 and 1884 in Lyttleton, Akaroa, New Zealand. He died on 25 April 1898 in Ashburton, Canterbury, New Zealand. David Strickland, 80yo Master Mariner; parents, details of birth and spouse were all "unknown;" survived by 3 male and 1 female issue. The informant was the master of the Old Men's Home where he was resident. He was buried at The Cemetery on 26 April 1898 in Ashburton, Canterbury, New Zealand. Rev IA Hamilton, Church of England, officiating. He died from Apoplexy (duration 5 days) attended by Dr James S (Trevor?) MRCSLSA.

Henry Robert STRICKLAND

Arrived in the Swan River Colony 13 February 1830 on the Hooghly with his parents and siblings.

Attended Perth Boys College in 1834.

Listed in the 1832 Census #556, aged 10 years also mentioned in the 1837 census listed as single and living in the Perth district.

On the 11 November 1840 was granted title to Perth Lot N11 and on the 10 March 1841 was granted free simple title to Perth lot L51.

4 April 1842 he opened a Brewery in St George's Terrace.

Left for Van Dieman's Land per "Waterlily" on the 10 November 1848 and in 1850 played in a cricket match in South Australia.

Whaler on Western Australian coast.

Worked with 'Stanley Brewery', Perth for 13 years.

Licensee of 'Freemason's Hotel' for 5 years.

'United Services Hotel' for 9 years. Cobb & Co coaches rumbled into the UNITED'S galleried courtyard, and its stables housed the States leading Racehorses, more than a 100 years ago. Its promotion to United Services Hotel came in 1839.

Owned land at 'Roelands' in south west.

Employed 3 Ticket of Leave men on occasions 1860, 1861 and 1872.

All the children were born at the "WELD" CLUB ("The Nest") Perth and lived there until 1865 - then domiciled at United Service Hotel, St George's Terrace, Perth.
