

ZAHEL (ZABEL). Arr. 28.11.1883 per Ballarat from Eastern colonies.

ZAMAN SHAH. One of last Afghans at Wyndham. Kept a store with Dahl Mahomet at 3-mile. Went to Perth and finally returned to Karachi.

ZANKER. Arr. 18.3.1886 (steerage) per Albany from S.A.

ZEDDI, Charles, d. 5.1886 (Derby), m. 1866 (Dardanup) Mary Anne COONAN. Chd. Sarah Anne, Margaret b. 1874, Kathleen. Correspondence re land 1866. Carpenter. Employed in 1.1869 in the building of RC Church at Bunbury laying the floor, building the altar and rails, painting, etc. Employed 9 T/L men on occasions 1865-1872 at Dardanup & Vasse. Pearler, Cossack 1873. He visited Albany 1884 accompanied by his daughter. Victualler, Roebourne, "Prince of Wales Hotel" 1879-1885. An important witness in a murder case 1885. Arr. Frem. from Cossack 22.6.1885 per Natal.

ZEDDI, Kathleen, m. Frederick Walter SMITH.

ZEDDI, Margaret, b. 1874, dtr. of Charles, m. Thomas PORTER.

ZEDDI, Sarah Ann, m. George SNOOK.

?ZEFFERT (listed as JEFFERT). Arr KGS 17.9.1882 per Rob Roy from Eastern colonies.

ZETTERBERG, Charles Emil, son of Charles Pador (tailor), m. 31.3.1888 (Frem. C/E) Sarah Ann TAYLOR, dtr. of James (engineer). Fremantle, seaman.

ZICOMINICH, d. 3.12.1888 (Hamelin Bay, Augusta). 3rd cook on SS Albany died after a boiler exploded.

ZIEGENIE (?LEIGNEER), Dora. Arr. per Abington 13.4.1884 from London.

ZIMPEL, William, b. Austria, son of David (stationer). Arr. c.1884, m.
3.2.1886 (Perth C/E) Frances Nellie HARLAND, dtr. of George (land
surveyor). Perth, cabinet and furniture manufacturer (at first in
partnership with Schwartz 1884). The business became noted for its
quality - a reputation sustained for three generations.
