

YAGAN. An Aboriginal of Perth district d. 1833, son of Midgigoroo. He was identified as the murderer of William Gaze 5.1832. Was caught & detained with 2 other Aboriginal offenders on Carnac Island where Robert Lyons volunteered to teach them civilised ways. They escaped & were soon in trouble stealing flour. Yagan's brother was killed. The Aborigine retaliated by killing 2 carters. Midgegoroo was caught & shot. Yagan was at large for 2 months & was shot 11.7.1833 by William Keats, who was killed in the affray. Yagan's boldness earned him the name of "The Wallace of the Age". He was commemorated in 1979 in a brass plaque in Perth pavements for the year 1833. A statue was later erected in his honour.

Chd. Louisa b. c.1874, Sophia Harriett b. 1876, Sarah b. 1879, Esther Baseley b. 1882 d. infancy, dtr. b. & d. 1883. An ex-soldier who worked for Haliday & after the latter's death was employed on railway construction. He employed a T/L woodcutter 1881. He died at the railway camp. Some of the Halliday children were known as Yam.

YANQUEST (?VANQUEST), Peter, b. 1802, d. 12.1834 (Albany). A crew member of a ship in transit, drowned.

YARDLEY, Leonard. Arr. per Glengoil 11.10.1884 from London. ?(W. L.) to Melbourne 18.7.1885 per South Australian.

YARDLEY, Tom. Arr. per Chollerton 24.3.1887.

YARDLEY, William, b. 1834, (expiree). Arr. 9.6.1862 per Norwood. Employed 16 T/L men on occasions 1863-1878 mostly shingle splitters and wood cutters, chiefly at Canning and William districts, but also at Kojonup, Sussex and Murray districts. Visited Singapore 20.8.1870 per Elderslie. Admitted to Mt Eliza Invalid Depot from Williams 8.3.1887.

YARRELL, James. Arr. per Miako 26.12.1886 from London.

YARWOOD, Richd, d. 8.1888. A coloured man found dead in hut at Bibra Lake - wood cutter - oddjob man. In 1884 was a cook to pilot crew at Rottnest.

YARWOOD, Thomas, b. 1819, (expiree). Arr. 18.10.1851 per Minden. Employed a T/L servant at Perth 1875.

YATES, Edward Abraham, b. 1839 (expiree), arr. possibly 10.8.1865 per Racehorse, m. 22.10.1868 (Bunbury) Margaret CONNELLY, she arr. 14.1.1868 per Tartar. Chd. Edward Abraham bp. 1870, Sarah Anne bp. 1871 (both Bunbury C/E). Ex soldier. Lit. C/E.

YATES, Fanny Jane, b. 1878, dtr. of William, m George Ernest BRIMSON.

YATES, Francis, (listed as Gates in WA, but Yates in Eng), son of Francis & Mary (of Warwickshire, Eng), arr. 2.1849 per Ameer as a Parkhurst boy. m. 7.12.1854 (Reg) & 4.1857 (Toodyay RC) Brigid O'MARA b. 1828/1831 d. 7.7.1907, dtr. of William & Mary (nee Daveney), she arr. 13.1.1853 per Travancore. Chd. Maria b. 1855 d. 1869 (diphtheria), Priscilla b. 1857 d. 1869 (diphtheria), Francis b. 1860 d. 1908, ?James Thomas b. 1862 d. 1941 (Northam). 1858 Shepherd for Dempster at "Buckland" Northam. Farmer 1860s (10ac/1856 & 10ac/1861). Employed 2 T/L men 1860 & 1867 at Toodyay. Storekeeper & Undertaker by 1869.

YATES, Francis, b. 4.1860 (Northam), d. 13.12.1908 (Northam), son of Francis & Brigid (nee O'Mara), m. Margaret FOLEY b. 5.12.1861 (Toodyay) d. 12.12.1908, dtr. of James & Brigid Mary (nee Ryan). Chd. Maria Ellen b. 1884 d. 1969, ?James b. 1888 d. 1907 (Northam). Farmer, Irishtown, Northam.

YATES, George. Guildford "Stirling Arms Hotel" (1888 Alm).

YATES, H. ?Fremantle, plasterer (1887 Alm). Perth, restaurant keeper (1888-9 Alm).

YATES, John, with wife Mary (nee Kirkman). Chd. John b. 1848 (Perth). Perth gardener. Visited SA 6.1848 per Minerva. John dep. for SA in 1848, his wife & child 1.1849 per Emma Sherratt. She & child returned to WA per Champion 12.5.1850 & back to SA 10.7.1850 per Empress. John to Mauritius 27.11.1867 per Sea Nymph.

YATES, John, b. 1833, (expiree). Arr. 11.2.1861 per Palmerston, m. ?Julia KELLY. Chd. John b. 1884 (Frem. RC). Sawyer on York Rd, Swan district. Employed 10 T/L men on occasions 1867-1874 including sawyers, woodcutter and cooks. Farmer (1887-1889 Alm). To Melbourne 11.6.1888 per South Australian.

YATES, Samuel, b. 1820, d. 22.1.1859 (Perth Military Hospital), son of Richard (printer), m. 1st? m. 2nd 31.7.1858 (Perth C/E) Matilda SHERWOOD, dtr. of Robert (brewer), she m. 2nd 18.1.1866 John HALLIDAY. Chd. James Samuel b. 1858 (Perth C/E). Private 12th Regt. Perth.

YATES, William, arr. 1840s. m. 3.2.1851 (Perth) Fanny CHEVASSANT b. 1821, she arr. 27.7.1850 per Sophia. Employed 6 T/L men 1851-1853.

YATES, William, b. 1839, d. 6.5.1889 (Chittering), (expiree). Arr. 29.5.1863 per Clyde, m. 7.8.1876 Sarah Jane WARREN b. c.1854, dtr. of Edward Arthur & Ellen (nee Dewar). She m. 2nd HUBBARD. Chd. Fanny Jane b. 1878, Samuel b. 1891 (Guildford West.) Sawyer, Guildford. Farmer Upper Swan. Employed 4 T/L men on occasions 1866, 1871 and 1881. He died when his cart overturned.

YEARSLEY, (Mrs) Jane. Arr. per Charlotte Padbury 20.9.1886 from London, with Mary & Agnes. 25.1.1887 - elder daughter married in Sydney. Mrs Y. applied for relief for herself and younger dtr. aged 5.

YEATMAN, James, b. 1814, d. 2.3.1891, (expiree). Arr. 2.6.1855 per Stag. Wife & chd. in U.K. Employed a T/L man at York 1863. Employed a T/L man 1880.

YEATS, Jabez Gael, son of James (gardener). Arr. possibly 11.1886 per Jens Anthon, m. 6.12.1887 (Frem. C/E) Helen ANDREWS, dtr. of Alfred & Elizabeth Burtenshaw (nee Cox), wid. of William Thompson. Fremantle labourer. Water policeman 1889.

YEATS, Samuel, b. 1804, d. 10.1.1865 (Northam) (expiree), arr. 5.4.1854 per Sea Park.

YEDDI, see ZEDDI.

YEIVILL (Pte), Benjamin, of 51st Regt. Stationed in WA 1840-1847. At Williamsburg 1840.

YELLAND, William, m. Mary. Chd. Edward b. 1866 (Perth C/E).

YELVERTON, Flora, b. 1863, dtr. of Henry, m. 1887 Charles James IRVINE.

In 1856 with W.D. Jackson pt. owner of Guyon. Owner of Arabian 84 tons 1858. Took up leases in Sussex district & est. a timber mill 1853. Erected steam sawmills to cut timber orders for C.A.Manning & Couchman (Admiralty Agents). Est. the timber mill, Lockerville at Quindalup & traded timber for wheat with SA merchants. Employed c.270 T/L men on occasions 1851-1871. Wife was postmistress. Commemorated in 1979 in a brass plaque in Perth pavement for year 1854.

Prop. of "Vulcan Arms" at Northam. By 1870s was well established farmer & storekeeper. Employed 4 T/L men on occasions 1865-1870.

YOUNG (YONG), Charles (a French Creole from Mauritius), b. 1835, d. 20.9.1880, m. (Caroline) Elizabeth. Chd. Mary b. c.1868, & another dtr. Employed a T/L man in partnership with Timlin 1869. To "Quarling", Williams district with his family. Camped with teamsters Richard Bolton & Joseph Mack. Young murdered the men, stabbed his wife (not fatally) and then committed suicide (Inq" 13.10.1880). His wife applied for admission to the Poorhouse 9.1880.

YOUNG, Charles ("Captain"), b. 1842, d. 1933, son of Isaac. Arr. Albany as a sailor, per Yankee, 4 masted sailing ship c.1860, and with the crew on point of mutiny, he deserted the vessel, m. 9.8.1879 (Busselton C/E) Mary THACKER, dtr. of William & Eliza (nee Cook).
