NADON, Isaac (NEEDON, Isaac), b. 1798, d. 1.12.1833, arr. 30.6.1831 per Sterling, seaman & crew member. He complained of treatment of crew during the voyage 5.1.1831-30.6.1831 by the owner Mr MacDermott. He was drowned while drunk.

NAGLE J. (NAGEL John), (expiree), arr. 9.6.1862 per Norwood. Gascoyne labourer (1884 Alm).

NAHAY(?), Pat. To Eastern colonies 3.11.1864 per Kestrel with wife & 3 chd.

NAIL, Enos. To SA 3.7.1857 per Bradley.

NAILAS, G. To SA 12.10.1865 per David & Jessie.

NAIREY, John, b. 1838 (expiree). Arr. 14.7.1867 per Norwood. Employed a T/L labourer at Victoria Plains 1875.

NAIRN, Miss (?Jane, dtr. of Major William Nairn), dep. 2.2.1842 per Grotius (?whaler) for USA with Mrs & Master Coffin. Dep. 1865 per Bridgetown as companion to Captain Phillip's wife on voyage to Singapore etc.

NAIRN, Amelia, b. 1843, dtr. of James & Sarah, m. 1867 Alexander FRANCISCO.

NAIRN, Amelia, m. Charles Frederick BAYLESS. Dongara, ?at Perth 1876-1881, schoolteacher 1888-9.

NAIRN, Charles, b. 9.7.1834 (WA), d. 3.1867, son of William & Mary Ann. To SA & returned 27.4.1856 per Robert Clive to work for brother-in-law Walter Padbury at "Yatheroo". Took his stock to North West in Tien Tsin pioneering North West in 1863. Was returning south per Emma 1867 when it was lost at sea.

NAIRN, Charles Joseph, b. c.1859, son of James & Sarah (nee Pettit), m.15.12.1898 Mary Grace ANDREWS. Bryo Station Murchison & then Northampton.

NAIRN, Charlotte, b. 1826, dtr. of William & Mary, m. 1844 Walter PADBURY.

NAIRN, Charlotte, b. 1851, dtr. of James & Sarah, m. 1871 Edward ROBERTS.

NAIRN, Ellen, b. 1856, dtr. of William & Jane, m. 1894 Richard ALLMOND.

NAIRN, Ellen, b. 1838, dtr. of William & Mary, m. 1st 1865 (Frem) James GRIEVES, m. 2nd 1874 Richard G. MEARES.

NAIRN, Emma, b. 1837, dtr. of William & Mary, m. 1858 James John OUGDEN.

NAIRN, Emma, bp. 21.4.1876, dtr. of William John & Sarah (nee Pell), m. 23.3.1905 George Douglas Graham STEWART.

NAIRN, Esther, b. 1863, d. 1934, dtr. of William & Jane, m. 1896 Matthew PADBURY.

NAIRN, Francis Edward, b. 1845, d. 1910, son of James & Sarah (nee Pettit), m. 18.12.1877 Harriet Emma LONG, dtr. of William & Sarah of Coorow. Chd. Margaret b. 1880, Amy b. 1883, Edith Harriet b. 1885. Dongara, farmer & grazier (1884-5 Alm).

NAIRN, Henry Robert Rawlinson, b. 21.12.1866, d. 1940, son of James & Sarah (nee Pettit), m. 1.10.1895 Emma Elizabeth ROWLAND bp. 21.5.1872, dtr. of Richard & Elizabeth (nee Rhodes). Dongara.

NAIRN, James, b. 1816, d. 10.12.1897 (Dongara), son of William & Mary Ann (nee Rawlinson), arr. 23.8.1829 per Marquis of Anglesea with parents, m. 16.3.1840 (Perth) Sarah PETTIT b. 1820 d. 13.8.1893 (Dongara), dtr. of John & Rebecca, who arr. 15.12.1829 per Gilmore. Chd. William John b. 1842, Amelia b. 1843, Francis Edward b. 1845, Clementine b. 1847, Charlotte b. 1851 d. 1942, Emma b. 1854, Walter b. 1856, Charles Joseph b. 1859, Jane b. 1860 d. 1945, Mary d. infancy, Henry Robert Rawlinson b. 1866 d. 1940. Perth 1840-50s. Sec. Perth, Sons of Australia Benefit Soc. 1849, Perth Lodge of Unity & member of Perth Town Trust 1850. To Victoria Plains & Irwin districts in 1860s. Chairman Irwin Rd. Bd. 1874. To "Byro Station" North West. Wife illit.

NAIRN, James, (?John) b. 11.8.1874 (Dongara), d. 26.9.1950 (Narrogin), son of William John & Sarah (nee Pell), m. 6.1.1906 (Perth) May EVANS b. 19.11.1875 (SA) d. 23.1.?1973. Chd. Dulcima Joyce b. 1917 (Perth) living 1978. Pastoralist "Byro Station" Murchison with parents, became manager until ill health forced him to go South. Worked as an agent, retired to Narrogin. Educ. Dongara.

NAIRN, Jane, b. 1832, dtr. of William & Mary Ann, m. 1850 Thomas ROACH.

NAIRN, Jane, b. 1801, d. 25.1.1878 (Perth), dtr. of Major William Nairn, arr. (possibly with her father) per Merope 7.4.1832, or 2.1.1840 per Westmoreland. To Albany as governess to chd. of J.R.Phillips. Miss Nairn owned 5 or 10 acres on Avon River near "Glenavon". She was governess to Lt. Slade's children & also taught the Cooke chd. Assisted Mrs Harper with Sunday School, Toodyay. After her father's death in 1853 at Frem, she went to Tasmania to join her brother, resident there.

NAIRN, Jane, b. 1860, d. 18.1.1945, dtr. of James & Sarah, m. Henry WHEELER.

NAIRN, Margaret, b. 1880, m. 1901 John Richard SHEPHERD.

NAIRN, Margaret Mary, b. 1823, dtr. of William, m. 1842 Thomas GRIGSON.

NAIRN, William, b. 1790, d. 28.11.1855 (Perth), arr. 23.8.1829 per Marquis of Anglesea, m. Mary Ann RAWLINSON b. 1793/6 d. 16.12.1870 (Perth). Chd. James b. 1816 d. 1897, Margaret Mary b. 1823, Charlotte b. 1826 d. 1895, William b. 1828 d. 1898, Jane b. 1832, Charles b. 1834 d. 1867, Emma b. 1837, Ellen b. 1838. Blacksmith, Perth, then Fremantle? Member St. John's Lodge, Freemasons, 1849.

NAIRN, (Major) William Frederick, b. 1767 d. 8.6.1853 (Frem), arr. 28.12.1831 per Egyptian, dep. for Tasmania & returned 7.4.1832 per Merope with stock. His wife arr. 1.1839 per Brothers. Dtrs. by first marriage arr. 2.1.1840 per Westmoreland. Twice married. Chd. (1st wife) Jane b. 1801 d. 1878, Eliza b. 1798/1803 d. 1867 (Frem), (2nd wife), William Edward b. 1811 d. 1869. Farmer & pastoralist in Canning district, he bt. Phillips' "Maddington". Bought Aranzau in 1833 for trading with Mauritius. Mrs Nairn went to Tasmania 11.1848 per Waterlily to join her son. Returned to Fremantle.

NAIRN, William, b. 1828, d. ?1898/1910 (SA), m. c.1854 Jane GRAVES (?in SA) b. 1830 d. 1910. Chd. All born SA but some came to WA in later life, Charles Thomas b. 1855 d. 1862, Ellen b. 1856, Ann b. 1858 d. 1860, William b. 1860 d. 1926, Alice b. 1862, Esther b. 1863 d. 1934, Charlotte b. 1865, Anne b. 1867, James b. 1869 d. 1935, Albert Victor b. 1871, Sydney b. 1874 d. 1958, Margaret Daisy b. 1876 d. 1877. Blacksmith Frem. He dep. for S.A. early 1850s.

NAIRN, William John, b. 22.1.1842, d.23.12.1918, son of James & Sarah (nee Pettit), m. 28.10.1873 Sarah Ann PELL b. 10.1.1852, dtr. of John & Esther (nee Bright). Chd. James b. & bp. 1874, d. 1950, Emma b. 1876, Christine Clementine bp. 1877, William John bp. 1883 d. 1884, Charlotte bp. 1885, Arthur Augustus bp. 1886, Charles Joseph Byro b. 1889, Alexander Murchison b. 1892, Norah b. 1894. Farmer. Irwin River: Pastoralist at "Bryo Station" until c. 1913, then to farm at Popanyinning with 2 youngest chd. Widow to Caversham with dtr., Norah.

NANCARROW, Emily, m. 1866 W. Charles GLASS.

NANCARROW, J. Northampton, miner & grazier. Employed a T/L butcher 1866.

NANCARROW, William, b. 1830, d. 7.4.1887 (Geraldton), arr. 11.9.1852 per Samuel with Capt. Hosken & to Geraldton 1.11.1852 per Pelsart, m. 19.3.1866 (Gwalla) Caroline DENNIS b. 1831 d. 22.4.1904 (Northampton). Chd. Amanda Dennis d.1886, Harriet Hannah b. 1871 d. 1886 (both of whooping cough). She was nominated 1865 as a migrant by William & arr. 7.3.1866 per Robert Morrison with cousin Emily b. c.1850. He was a miner. Applied for 10,000 acres pastoral lease in 1863. Employed 16 T/L men on occasions 1864-1875. He visited SA dep. 28.1.1884 & returned 7.5.1884 per Franklin. Residence Marine Terrace, Geraldton.

NANCELLES, John. In 1832/3 petitioned for C/E clergyman.

NANKIVELL. Arr. 13.10.1886 per Ganges from Eastern colonies.

NANKLOW, John. Sought temporary outdoor poor relief at Frem. 5.5.1888.

NANSON, John Leighton, b. 22.9.1863 (England), d. 2.1916 (England), son of John (solicitor), to W.A. mid 1880s from S.A., m. 8.10.1887 (Frem. C/E) Janet Drummond DURLACHER b. 23.4.1868 (Toodyay) d. 14.12.1943, dtr. of Alfred & Deborah (nee Clarkson). Chd. Deborah Caroline b.1892, John d. infancy. Educ. Carlisle Grammar School (England) & King William College, Isle of Man. Left Broken Hill (N.S.W.) mid 1880s for W.A. Journalist at Fremantle. To S.A. to work in Commercial Bank & was accountant in their new Perth branch 1893. When the bank went into liquidation he joined staff of "West Australian". Bought an interest in "Morning Herald" which he later sold to Bishop Gibney. MLA for Murchison 4.1905. In ill health, went abroad c.1905. Studied law in England & was called to Bar. Returned to W.A. Member for Greenough, Attorney General 5.1909. His wife was 1st woman journalist to have a seat in Press Gallery W.A. Parliament.

NAPIER, Clive Hastings, son of David John & Mary Ann (nee Cargill). Arr. 31.3.1886 per Wistaria from S.A., m. 1st Florence HURST, b. c.1867 d.1904, dtr. of John & Elizabeth (nee Reader), she arr. 11.2.1887 per Australind, m. 2nd c.1906 Katherine PAINE. Chd. John Howard Hastings, Dudley Clive b. c.1894, Kenneth Cargill. He was paymaster in Dept. of Goldfields Water Supply. He left for New Zealand c.1919. Educ. Hailebury & in Naval Architecture.

NAPP (KNAPP), J. or T. Perth. Sailmaker (1884 Alm).

NARD, Ben. Employed a T/L labourer 1870.

NARDINE, Eliza, bp. 18.4.1866 Champion Bay.

NARROWAY, Charlotte, m. 1845 James Dagley GIBBS.

NARROWAY, J. Arr. 22.5.1844 per Trusty ?with Charlotte.

NARROWAY, William, b. Eng, d. 10.3.1871 (Australind), arr. 22.5.1844 per Trusty, m. Sarah b. 1790 (Eng) d. 26.12.1872 (Australind). Accompanied Allnutt 1860s. Blackwood district.

NASH, George, arr. 4.8.1838 per Shepherd at Frem. Proposed Steam Navig. Co. on Swan River 14.4.1841. Dep. 2.1848 per Merope to take up Holy Orders.

NASH, Henry, b. 1812 (expiree), arr. 24.10.1850 per Hashemy. Dep. 27.4.1856 per Guyon for SA.

NASH, James (Capt). Master Mariner of Bungaree Fremantle 1870s & 1880s. His wife & child accompanied him on several voyages to Mauritius & Melbourne.

NASH, James, m. 28.6.1868 (Frem) Margaret Agnes MEANEY b. 1845 d. 19.5.1875 (Frem), she arr. 20.8.1866 per Palestine. Chd. Annie Agnes b. 1873 d. 1874.

NASH, James. Overseer at a Gascoyne Pastoral Station (1884-9 Alm).

NASH, (Capt) James, m. 19.7.1877 (Frem. Congreg) Laura Hannah BIRCH (widow) b. 19.7.1846 (W.A.) d. 11.10.1885, dtr. of Edmund & Ethel (nee Stirling). Pilot at Rottnest. Master of Sea Ripple.

NASH, Jane, b. 1832, m. 1852 Augustus SCHMIDT.

NASH, John, b. 1820, arr. 25.6.1840 per Runnymede, m. Mary TICHBORNE b. 1820 (widow of ?Henshaw). Chd. John b. 1846. Pte. 51st Regt. Stationed at Mahogany Creek 1840 & then to H.Q. Perth.

NASH, John, b. 1812, d. 29.8.1856, arr. 2.4.1856 per William Hammond as an Enrolled Pensioner Guard. Formerly Pte 77th Regt.

NASH, L.E. Arr. 26.8.1885 per Annie McDonald from London.

NASH, Louisa, b. 1855. Arr. 28.8.1875 per Daylight from London. Domestic Servant.

NASH, Lucy Maria, b. 1836, m. 1st 1853 William CARTER, m. 2nd 1874 Horton BATEMAN.

NASH, Margaret, dtr. of Denis, m. 1853 Henry DREW.

NASH, Margaret Agnes, b. 1848, d. 19.5.1875 (Frem). ?Dtr. Annie Agnes b. 4.1873 d. 21.8.1874 (Frem).

NASH, Richard West, b. 1808, d.22.12.1850 (Eng), arr. 20.4.1839 per Hindoo (cabin) with wife (nee M. Schoales). Barrister, joined with Schoales (brother-in-law) in farming at Swan. Served briefly as Acting Advocate General in WA 1841 & later in 1846 apptd to the position. Sec. Agric. Soc. 1844 & of Vineyard Soc. 1846. Published "Cultivation of Vine & Olive in WA". Returned to Eng. 8.1.1849 per Empress of China. Promoted the Colonization Assurance Corporation with the purpose of sending migrants to WA. The venture failed after the arrival of the 1st ship load per Will Watch possibly due to Nash's premature death.

NASH, Sarah, m. 1897 James TRUBEE.

NASH, Sarah Ann. Arr. 30.4.1877 per Lady Louisa, m. (1st) John TURNER, (2nd) John ROACH. Applied for 50 acres Cockburn district in 1880 as an immigrant's grant.

NASH, Thomas, b. 1817, d. 7.3.1879 (Mt. Eliza Invalid Depot) (expiree). Arr. either 1851 or 1855.

NASH, Thomas, b. 1819 (expiree). Arr. 2.6.1855 per Stag, wife & chd. in U.K. Employed a T/L man 1868 at Greenough.

NASH, William, (a sailor), d. 11.4.1841 (Perth).

NASH, William (alias FULKER), b. 1834 (expiree), son of Edward (nurseryman), arr. 29.3.1856 per William Hammond, m. 1st (Eng), m. 2nd 4.11.1867 (York Wesl) Sarah Ann LONGBOTTOM b. 1849/50, dtr. of George (farmer). Painter & sailor before arrival. York labourer 1867. Wife illit.

NASH, William. Arr. 24.3.1887 per Chollerton.

NASH, William Amos, b. 1859. Arr. 26.5.1877 per Hastings from London.

NASSEBB, John, d. 3.12.1860 (Perth).

NATEN (?NATTON), S. Frem. farmer (1883-1884 Alm).

NATHAN, Joseph. Employed a T/L labourer 1873 at the mines Champion Bay.

NATHAN, Lewis, (or Lewis Nothan). Arr. 16.9.1887 per Helena Mena from London. Tailor's machinist.

NATHAN, Robert. Dep. 23.2.1887 per Australind for North West & Singapore.

NATHERWOOD, C. Employee WAGR Loco branch, subscribed to Greenough flood relief fund 1888.

NATTON, James, b. 1824, son of James N. Customs House Officer, arr. at Albany c.1842, m. 1.1.1854 (Albany) Joanna LUKEY b. 1832, dtr. of Daniel L. (cabinet maker). Dep. 22.2.1856 per Robert Clive for Eastern colonies.

NATRASS. To Geraldton from Frem. 23.2.1887 per Australind.

NAUGHTON, see NORTON.

NAUGHTON, Mrs (Indistinguishable).  
Dairykeeper. Perth (1884-1889 Alm).

NAUGHTON, (Mrs) Alice. With an infant, was deserted by her husband who was thought to be in North West, applied for poor relief 1881.

NAUGHTON, Denis, d. 20.12.1883, m. Elizabeth McCANN. Chd. (Perth RC) Helen Alma b. 1881, Catherine b. 1882. Perth, compositor (1877-1884 Alm). Employed a T/L painter 1875. Wife was a boarding housekeeper 1886.

NAUGHTON (NORTON), Edward, (Indistinguishable).  
Toodyay farmer 1877.  
Cossack pearler & seaman 1873-1889.

NAUGHTON, Edward, b. 1831 (expiree), arr. 18.7.1855 per Adelaide. Shoemaker at Perth employing 5 T/L shoemakers on occasions 1863-1866. ?To Pinjarra as shoemaker (1884 Alm). ?Wife was a storekeeper at Pinjarra (1880 Alm). ?= Edward NORTON who m. Jane. Chd. George b. 1867 d. 1867, Elizabeth Jane b. 1868.

NAUGHTON (NORTON), Joseph, b. 1824/7, d. 28.6.1881 (Perth), arr. 15.8.1865 per Racehorse as an Enrolled Pensioner Guard with wife Bridget SMITH b. 1833 (Ireland) d. 30.8.1911 (widow of Denis, nee Bulger). Chd. Stepchild Kate Smith b. c.1858, Patrick b. 1863, Margaret b. 1866, Christopher Joseph b. 1870, Emily & Mary b. 1872, ?Denis & others (Perth/Frem RC). Formerly Pte East India Co. (Administrative Office). ?Employed 3 T/L men at Frem. on occasions 1875 & 1878 including 2 painters & a sawyer. (Headstone E.Perth Joseph LAUGHTON, Sgt. 2nd Battn. of Bengal Fusiliers d. 22.6.1881 at 54 yrs & wife Brigid d. 30.8.1911 aged 78 yrs).

NAUGHTON, J. Corporal of 96th Regt. He arr. after the Regt (which came 22.2.1847 per Java) & when the detachment left in 5.1849 he was not included. ?This man escaped from the lockup 18.11.1849 (see John Norton).

NAVAN, Thomas E., b. 1835 (expiree). Arr. 11.2.1861 per Palmerston. Employed a T/L servant at Noolooloo, Victoria Plains.

NAVARDO, Enrique. Arr. 11.9.1885 per Glenrowan, one of 13 in Bishop Salvado's group.

NAVEN, Elizabeth, b. 1832, arr. 13.6.1853 per Sabrina. Domestic servant from Dublin.

NAVIN, Bartholomew, b. 1843 (Ireland), arr. 8.4.1863 per Burlington. Shepherd.

NAWLAN (?NOLAN), Mary, b. 1810, arr. 13.6.1853 per Sabrina & ?family. (She had rented 20 acres land in Kilkenny Ireland). Chd. Catherine b. 1833 (housemaid), Ellen b. 1837 (never in service), Edward b. 1839, Margaret b. 1841.

NAWTIN, Rachel, m. John WARE.

NAYLOR, Abraham, b. 1831, d. 3.1875 (expiree). Arr. 3.7.1857 per Clara. Employed 3 T/L sawyers, 1868 Busselton, 1870 Swan, 1872 Whitby Falls.

NAYLOR, Annie & Jane, dep. for SA 3.7.1857 per Bradley (SA Reg).

NAYLOR (NEYLAN), Bridget, b. 1844, arr. 23.3.1865 per Fitzroy.

NAYLOR, Emma, dtr. of John, m. 1879 David SCOTT.

NAYLOR, Emma Agnes, dtr. of Henry Dyson & Henrietta, m. 1872 John Oringe BEATTY.

NAYLOR, Emma. Arr. 25.9.1875 per Charlotte Padbury (cabin).



NAYLOR, George Edward, b. 1861/2 (England), d. 27.7.1941 (W.A.), son of Henry Dyson & Henrietta (nee Wells), arr. as an infant with parents (Enrolled Pensioner) per Norwood 9.6.1862, m. 20.1.1889 (Frem. C/E) Mary Ann WILKINS b. 30.1.1863 (Toodyay) d. 25.6.1944, dtr. of Henry & Bridget Agnes (nee Kennedy). Chd. George, Veronica May b. 1891 d. 1971, Clarice Bertha. Frem. Bootmaker (1884-9 Alm). Shipwright Frem. Employed by Frem. Harbour Trust. C/E.

NAYLOR, Henry Dyson, b. 1826, d. 26.3.1894 (Frem), son of Thomas, arr. 9.6.1862 per Norwood (with family) as an Enrolled Pensioner Guard, m. 15.7.1855 (Eng) Henrietta WELLS b. 1832 d. 20.10.1909 (Frem), dtr. of George Edward & Emma Agnes. Chd. Emma Agnes b. 1856, George Edward b. 1862 bp. 1863 d. 1941, Henrietta bp. 1863, Thomas bp. 1863 (Perth), John Alexander b. 1867 d. 1940, William Alfred b. 1870 d. 1945, Martha Anne b. 1871. Pte 13th Dragoons, veteran of Crimean War, Chelsea Pens. Stationed at Frem. posted briefly to Camden Harbour (1865). Lived at Fremantle Barracks. Promoted Cpl. 1881. In 1876 was granted Koojee Loc P8/20ac. but lived at Frem. where he was employed as a butcher. C/E.

NAYLOR, John Alexander, b. 23.2.1867 (Frem), d. 1.7.1940, son of Henry Dyson & Henrietta (nee Wells), m. 31.8.1887 (Frem) Isabel HOWSON, dtr. of Thomas & Rachel, who arr. 6.7.1880. Frem. Baker. C/E.

NAYLOR, Joseph, b. 1831 (England), d. 11.9.1917 (Bunbury) (expiree). (next of kin Elizabeth Bamford, Radcliffe Bridge, Lancs). Arr. 29.1.1862 per Lincelles, m. 8.1.1877 (Australind) Elizabeth HALL b. 1858 d. 7.4.1937 (Bunbury), dtr. of Richard (farmer). Chd. Mary Jane b. 1878, Richard b. 1880, William John bp. 1882 (Donnybrook), George Henry b. 1887, Maria b. 1890, Lucia Gladys b. 1898, & 2 dtrs. Bunbury, storekeeper (1887-1889 Alm). Employed 2 T/L men 1869. (Reported as leaving for U.S.A. 1875, an error in fact). C/E. Wife RC.

NEAGLE, James. Arr. 24.3.1887 per Chollerton, with wife Harriet. Chd. Ernest, William, Beatrice, Clifford.

NEAGLE, Julia, b. 1844, dtr. of Maurice, m. 1863 Aimable Giril DUPEROUZEL.

NE(A)GLE, Margaret, dtr. of Maurice, m. 1854 Richard NEWPORT.

NEAGLE, Maurice, arr. 13.1.1853 per Travancore with family (unlisted), m. Mary McCARTHY. Chd. Margaret b. 1834 d. 1901, Julia b. 1844 (Irel) d. 1926.

NYE, N. Employed a T/L labourer in Plantagenet district 1870.

NYE, P. Arr. 74.1.1880 at Frem. from KGS per Rob Roy. Groom (?) employed by Avery & accompanied him 17.12.1880 per Janet to Batavia. Ret. with "a native" 17.2.1881 per Janet.

NYE, William, b. 1787/1800, d. 10.10.1840 (Guildford), arr. 5.8.1829 per Calista with brother John, an employee of Latour. Fisherman.

NYE, William E. Arr. 24.9.1886 per Helena Mena from London, wife Rebecca. Chd. Herbert.

NYLAN(D), Martin, b. 1813 (expiree). Arr. 19.8.1853 per Robert Small. Admitted from Toodyay to Mt. Eliza Invalid Depot 8.12.1887.

NYULASY, Charles William, d. 29.5.1889 (Roebourne). From KGS to Frem. 7.3.1884 per Otway from Victoria. From KGS to Frem. 4.3.1887 per Rob Roy. 1886-1889 3rd Surveyor Lands & Survey Dept. Warden of Pilbarra Goldfield 1888-9. Body sent to Victoria for burial.
